City of Dubrovnik initiatives undertaken as a response to COVID-19 crisis

To overcome and mitigate the effects of the crisis caused by the global coronavirus pandemic, the City of Dubrovnik has prepared and presented a package of measures for vulnerable groups and businessmen. The package of measures for vulnerable groups is 17.15 million HRK (approx. 2.5 million EUR), while the financial forgiveness measures for businessmen are 'heavy' 28.75 million HRK (approx. 4 million EUR).
