Dujiangyan COVID-19 epidemic prevention measures and experience sharing

After the outbreak of COVID-19, in order to avoid the cross-infection caused by gathering, since January 25th, World Cultural Heritage --Mt. Qingcheng and Dujiangyan Water Conservancy Project had been temporarily closed. On May 1st, the scenic area restarted to receive tourists when the epidemic was brought under control in China.

Type of initiative: Recovery of cultural and educational activities (historic sites, museums, events, etc.)

In order to consolidate the achievements that we made in fighting the epidemic, we took various scientific and effective measures on scenic area management. The daily tourists were limited to 30% of the maximum capacity of the scenic area. The tourists were required to make reservations online in advance, and their health certificate QR code would be checked before entering. Fences and six moveable ticket check passages were set up at the entrance of the scenic area to avoid gathering. Meanwhile, large-area non-contact 5G+ infrared temperature measurement were implemented, equipped with intelligent infrared helmets to randomly check the temperature of tourists.
